## **February Snowdrop Days**

The Bank Hall snowdrops can be relied on to put on a spectacular show and the 2024 season was no exception. These precious little flowers attracted a huge number of visitors and 'Bank Hall Snowdrop Days' are now becoming well established as one of the best in the North West. 1,880 visitors attended this year with 736 new visitors (not been before). Of course, an event like this could not go ahead without a dedicated team of volunteers to make sure everything went according to plan. This year the Friends were selling snowdrops which has helped in boosting funds that go towards Bank Hall projects.

Outdoor events are always at the mercy of the weather and persistent rain in January and February combined with the large number of visitors meant that the wood chip paths had become extremely muddy and slippy underfoot, so as a safety precaution the final Wednesday and Sunday of the snowdrop season were cancelled. However, with help from Friends of Lytham Hall the paths were soon repaired ready for the next event.



Our very successful annual Easter event took place on Saturday 30th March. Children enjoyed the Bunny Hunt and Woodland Wildlife Trail and were rewarded with an Easter Egg at the end of the trail. People came dressed up to add to the fun of the event. Refreshments, Bric-a-brac stall (in aid of the Potting Shed Project) Merchandise Stall and pre booked Prospect Tower and Exhibition visits were all available on the day.

It was through Gordon that the Bank Hall Action Group was formed in July 1995 and the first meetings were held in Croston. Gordon was also the first Chairman of the Bank Hall Action Group (now the Friends of Bank Hall).
