# Volunteering Recruitment

Since the role of Volunteer Recruitment Team Lead was created last Summer, we have seen a significant growth in Volunteer numbers in every area that FoBH engages. Sally Wilson took on this role as a Member Volunteer and her professional background included recruitment and head-hunting across different market sectors. Sally said "unlike recruiting people for jobs, volunteer motivation is very different and is governed by interest, availability/flexibility of time, and the social considerations of meeting new people and having fun while contributing to a worthy cause. We have to remember volunteers have a life beyond FoBH too!".

A total of 20 volunteers have joined since last September: **Grounds team - 7** (one left due to ill health). **Tower Guide team - 2** (one is also a member of the Archives team). **Walled Garden team - 11** (three transferred from the Grounds team, one is a member of

both teams). The Walled Garden team is new and until a Team Lead is appointed, the work is being jointly supervised by Sally and Chairman, John Howard.

The use of social media and having a volunteer recruitment stall at events has attracted most interest, plus two volunteers have come by way of connections with Bank Hall residents. Sally explained "We have volunteers with widespread backgrounds, including the police force, specialist education, heritage tour guiding and research, primary teaching, community development, marketing, gardening and allotment keeping, all willing to share their knowledge and interests. Some of the more established volunteers help out with events and once the Garden team settle in no doubt some will wish to help out further too". Sally also advised she's set herself a target of having a bank of 40 volunteers by this time next year!
