Peter Banister 1930 - 2023

Peter and his wife Eileen played a big part in the group in the early years and Peter could be found many a time clearing the grounds and the Hall of its cloak of ivy and debris. Eileen was part of the original refreshment team and volunteered alongside Anne Johnson for many years.

Due to declining health both took a step back from the group but Eileen still came to the snowdrop events annually until sadly she died in 2020. Peter then went to live in a nursing home and by

chance I managed to see him a few months ago whilst visiting another resident as a patient. He appeared well and was really pleased that I had visited him and that he could see some photos I had taken of the restored Bank Hall. He was actually a descendent of the 'Banastres of Bank'. John Howard

Peter was a childhood friend of my late mother and it was through Peter my journey with Bank Hall began. A chance remark to mum after seeing an article in the Lancashire Evening Post about the plight of Bank Hall resulted in Peter offering to take me to my first group meeting in January 1997. Peter continued to collect me and take me to meetings at The Lord Nelson pub in Croston for many years. He was a true gentleman and on the times when we worked in the grounds together he would always have a hot drink and biscuits in his car to keep me going. I will always remember Peter and I will remain ever grateful to him for enabling me to become involved with such an important campaign.

David Taylor 1944 - 2023

My brother David joined Bank Hall Action Group in 2005 and initially worked in the grounds. He helped with visiting groups such as the Challenge Group, where he used his woodworking skills instructing teenagers in the making of bird boxes. He also used those same skills to make Animal and Easter Bunny templates for the trails which are still in use today.

When BHAG changed to the Friends of Bank Hall he became a Trustee and for many years managed the entrance hut. He was always willing to help in a practical way and gave a levelled opinion at Trustee meetings.

David took early retirement from the Ambulance Service a few years after he contracted Myasthenia Gravis, a neurological condition that could be controlled but in 2019 he was also diagnosed with Motor Neurone disease. Not long after, his condition became quite serious due to breathing difficulties but he fought back and always kept positive. He gradually became immobile but wanted to remain as a Trustee and was still able to add his input to the group. Sadly, due to Covid and subsequently the debilitating nature of MND, he was never able to visit the Hall after it was restored but maintained his interest in the activities of the Friends of Bank Hall.

Wood chip Workout!
