News from the grounds

The grounds, post covid lockdown were looking in a sorry state with masses of overgrown vegetation and weeds. Volunteers came forward to join the team that planned to work one midweek day each week. The pool currently stands at 14, with a typical attendance of between six and ten on any given day. The bulk of the work entails clearing unwanted vegetation which is basically Himalayan balsam, nettles, sycamore seedlings/saplings, wild raspberries and brambles. The latter being the most numerous and biggest challenge. Selected areas within the 15 acre grounds were targeted, which has resulted in dramatically opening up these areas allowing many of the fine redwoods etc to be fully appreciated for their beauty. An extra bonus being a lovely show of snowdrops within many of the cleared areas. The team spent **December and January woodchipping** all the paths in readiness for our snowdrop open Sundays, and how well the paths now look. So February is the time for a well earned break, and I know we are all raring to go again as spring approaches, determined to make the grounds as beautiful as we can for the general public to enjoy (and also ourselves).
